Paper seminars

- The [papers are available in a Box folder](#).
- There are no pre-assigned chairpersons for the seminars. The groups are free to choose a chairperson or organize themselves as they like.
- A recommended workflow
 - Presenting doctoral student starts with eventual clarifications for 1-2 minutes
 - Doctoral student commentator starts and discussion with comments and discussion for 5 minutes
 - Senior commentator continues with her remarks and discussion for another 5 minutes
 - Rest of the time (15 min+) will be available for everyone to participate in the discussion
- General instructions
 - Remember to be constructive and polite in your feedback
 - Focus on issues that are helpful for completing the thesis rather than on marginal issues of your own interest
 - Be mindful of time, formulate questions and comments that are short and to the point
 - Remember that there is time after the seminar during the breaks etc. to continue discussion
 - As a presenter, don't use too much time to explain and tell about your research. It can be more helpful that you get comments and ideas from as many seminar participants as possible
 - If you don't find your name in any of the groups in a session, you are free to choose whatever group you like. Supervisors are, if necessary, kindly asked to be prepared to switch groups if it turns out that one of the groups has a lot of attendance and another very few participants.

1-2 minute madness session

All workshop participants (doctoral students and supervisors) will have a maximum one minute (60 sec) to give a very

quick introduction on the research you are currently doing and/or about to start working on. Your slide will be shown when you are talking and you will be notified when you are expected to stop. If you have many projects you are welcome to highlight some things you find interesting to tell this particular audience.
